#### INTRODUCTION

#### 1.1 Description of University

Founded in 1895, The University of Texas at Arlington (UTA) is a Carnegie Research-1 "Very High Research Activity" institution with more than 100 years of academic excellence and tradition.

It is a comprehensive research, teaching, and public service university whose mission is the advancement of knowledge and the pursuit of excellence.

With a global enrollment of more than 60,000, UT Arlington is the largest university in North Texas. It also has one of the most diverse campus populations in the country. Students come from every state and more than 100 countries, contributing to *U.S. News & World Report* ranking it with the fifth-highest undergraduate ethnic diversity index in the country. UT Arlington is a Hispanic-Serving Institution and is ranked No. 1 in the U.S. for veterans and their families by *Military Times*.

The University has research centers in every discipline and state-of-the-art facilities in Arlington and Fort Worth that enable our faculty and students to help solve the world's most urgent challenges. Of its 220,000-plus alumni, approximately 65% percent live in North Texas. Their presence helps the University create an annual economic impact of almost \$17.1 billion in the region.

#### 1.2 Background and Special Circumstances

At UTA, we have a centralized computing environment that is managed by our Information Technology team. Like most in higher education, we also operate in a decentralized Information Technology environment where some computers and data are primarily managed by individual departments or academic researchers.

Many higher ed institutions have been successfully hacked/attacked in recent years. The ability and timing needed to restore operations and data at these institutions often took longer than anticipated. At UTA, we believe we have learned from these and other incidents. With that said, we would like to perform an audit to help identify preparedness and other opportunities that we could use to strengthen our back-up and recovery procedures, controls, processes and practices.

This Request for Proposals (RFP) is being released under the non-exclusive services master agreements currently on file for Audit Services with the University of Texas System. The University of Texas at Arlington will hold the primary agreement resulting from this solicitation.

The University of Texas at Arlington is soliciting statements of work and qualifications from Professionals to provide IT Security Audit Services for UT Arlington. Services to be provided in accordance with the terms, conditions, and requirements set forth in this Request for Proposals.

### 1.3 Objective of Request for Proposal

The University of Texas at Arlington (**University**) is soliciting proposals from qualified vendors to perform work (**Work**) more specifically described in **Scope of Work** Document of this Request for Proposals (**RFP**).

UTA Audit is soliciting proposals in response to select a vendor currently contracted under a Master Services Agreement (MSA) to provide services under a fixed fee contract, inclusive of travel and other expenses, to perform an internal audit of Backup Operations and Recovery Planning for UTA as a service to our internal audit department. Ideally services would begin in July should be completed by September 1, 2023.

#### 1.4 Term of the Agreement

#### 1.5 Transition Period

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### 1.6 Group Purchase Authority

Texas law authorizes institutions of higher education (defined by §61.003, Education Code) to use the group purchasing procurement method (ref. §§51.9335, 73.115, and 74.008, Education Code). Additional Texas institutions of higher education may therefore elect to enter into a contract with the successful Proposer under this RFP. In particular, Proposer should note that University is part of The University of Texas System (UT System), which is comprised of fourteen institutions described at <a href="http://www.utsystem.edu/institutions">http://www.utsystem.edu/institutions</a>. UT System institutions routinely evaluate whether a contract resulting from a procurement conducted by one of the institutions might be suitable for use by another, and if so, this RFP could give rise to additional purchase volumes. As a result, in submitting its proposal, Proposer should consider proposing a pricing model and other commercial terms that take into account the higher volumes and other expanded opportunities that could result from the eventual inclusion of other institutions in the purchase contemplated by this RFP. Any purchases made by other institutions based on this RFP will be the sole responsibility of those institutions.

### 2.3 Criteria for Selection

The successful Proposer, if any, selected by University through this RFP will be the Proposer that submits a proposal on or before the Submittal Deadline that is the most advantageous to University. **Contractor** means the successful Proposer under this RFP.

Proposer is encouraged to propose terms and conditions offering the maximum benefit to University in terms of (1) service, (2) total overall cost, and (3) project management expertise.

The evaluation of proposals and the selection of Contractor will be based on the information provided in the proposal. University may consider additional information if University determines the information is relevant.

Criteria to be considered by University in evaluating proposals and selecting Contractor, will be these factors:



#### 2.3.1 Threshold Criteria Not Scored

Ability of University to comply with laws regarding purchases from persons with disabilities.

#### 2.3.2 Scored Criteria

- 2.3.2.1 Cost of goods and services (20%);
- 2.3.2.2 Reputation of the Proposer and of the Proposer's goods or services (20%);
- 2.3.2.3 Quality of the Proposer's goods or services (30%);
- 2.3.2.4 Extent to which the goods or services meet the University's needs (20%);
- 2.3.2.5 Proposer's past relationship with the University (2%);
- 2.3.2.6 Total long-term cost to the University of acquiring the Proposer's goods or services (0%); and
- 2.3.2.7 Any other relevant factors that a private business entity would consider in selecting a vendor (8%)

### **SUBMISSION OF PROPOSAL**

#### 3.1 Number of Copies

Proposer must submit a complete copy of its entire proposal according to the instructions provided in this RFP. A signature by an authorized officer of Proposer must appear on the <u>Execution of Offer</u> (ref. **Section 2** of **APPENDIX ONE**) of the submitted proposal.

#### 3.2 Submission

University will not accept proposals submitted by email or fax. All proposals and required documents must be submitted through the University's online portal at <a href="https://www.bidnetdirect.com//arlington">www.bidnetdirect.com//arlington</a>.

### 3.3 Proposal Validity Period

Each proposal must state that it will remain valid for University's acceptance for a minimum of one hundred eighty (180) days after the Submittal Deadline, to allow time for evaluation, selection, and any unforeseen delays.

#### 3.4 Terms and Conditions

- 3.4.1 Proposer must comply with the requirements and specifications contained in this RFP, including the <u>Terms and Conditions</u> (ref. **Section 4** and **APPENDIX TWO**), the <u>Notice to Proposer</u> (ref. **Section 2**), <u>Proposal Requirements</u> (ref. **APPENDIX ONE**) and the <u>Specifications and Additional Questions</u> (ref. **Section 5**). Proposer must submit the following information as part of Proposer's proposal:

- 5.3.1 If Proposer takes exception to any terms or conditions set forth in **APPENDIX TWO**), Proposer must submit a list of the exceptions.

  - 1. Project team members (by name), including staffing levels and qualifications.
  - 2. Examples of prior projects that are similar in size and scope.
  - 3. Methodology and techniques to be used to identify and test key controls.
  - 4. Proposed project timing and schedule (preference will be given to firms with resources available to meet the desired timeline as indicated).

### 5.4 Scope of Work

6 Proposers should include a copy of their current University of Texas System executed Auditing Services contract with their technical response to this RFP.

Contractor will provide the following services to University:

- 5.4.1 We are currently looking for a third-party provider to provide us with a Senior Auditor level associate to perform this work.
- 5.4.2 Assess the design and test the effectiveness of backup operations and recovery planning for select systems, services and infrastructure managed by UTA
- 5.4.3 Evaluate compliance with any applicable Federal and State regulations and UT System policies including, but not limited to, Texas Administrative Code §202 Security Control Standards, UT Systemwide Policy 165: Information Resources Use and Security Standards, and Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) Security Rule standards. Specifically, the scope will include a review of the policies and procedures in place regarding data backup and recovery activities. Additionally, the audit scope will cover our backup systems and storage resources to help ensure they are performing adequately and correctly. We plan to include testwork to determine whether UTA is following relevant backup and recovery controls. Finally, we'd like to assess whether we have similar back and recovery functions in place for key decentralized computing environments. In summary, the

overall audit objective is to determine whether UTA is prepared to restore appropriate files and computing capabilities in the event of a cyber security or ransomware attack.

- 5.4.4 Perform Audit Process Planning
- 5.4.5 Complete Audit Fieldwork including covering findings with relevant UTA employees
- 5.4.6 Provide DRAFT written audit report for review using UTA's audit format. The report will include the opportunity, audit recommendation as well as management's response for addressing the recommendation.
- 5.4.7 Before beginning and upon completion of each of these three steps, the assigned auditor will discuss approach and results with UTA's Chief Auditor. The workpaper review process will be performed by the third-party vendor. However, adequate summary back-up supporting all findings will be provided to UTA's Chief Auditor.

#### 6.2.1 Travel Expenses

#### AIR TRAVEL AND RENTAL CAR

At this time, Contractor may not book air travel or rental car directly with travel vendors and obtain the State rates. If the UT institution books air travel and rental car for Contractor and pays the travel vendor directly (direct bill to UT), then the UT institution will receive the State rate for Contractor's airfare and rental car.

### HOTEL RESERVATIONS

State Hotel Rates: A hotel under contract with the State may, at the hotel's discretion, offer the State rate for Contractor travel. The hotel, at the hotel's discretion, may permit the Contractor to book and pay the reservation or may require the UT institution to book and pay the reservation (direct bill to UT). The UT institution should contact the hotel to ask if (1) the hotel honors the State rate for Contractor travel, and (2) the hotel requires UT to book and pay the reservation (direct bill to UT).

UT Negotiated Hotel Rates: The UT institution may obtain the UT negotiated hotel rates (when available) for Contractor travel. The UT institution should contact the hotel to confirm the reservation and ask if the hotel requires UT to pay for the reservation (direct bill to UT).

Be aware that if UT institutions book travel for Contractor, then any cancellation charges will be charged to the UT institution.

University will reimburse, without mark-up, reasonable expenses (including meals, rental car or mileage, coach class airfare, and lodging) validly incurred by Contractor directly and solely in support of Work and approved by University in advance. Contractor will be subject to the then-current Travel Reimbursement Rates promulgated by the Comptroller of Public Accounts for the State of Texas at <a href="https://fmx.cpa.state.tx.us/fm/travel/travelrates.php">https://fmx.cpa.state.tx.us/fm/travel/travelrates.php</a> with regard to all travel expenses. Contractor will not be reimbursed by University for expenses that are prohibited or that exceed the allowable amounts provided in the then current Travel Reimbursement Rates. As a condition precedent to receiving reimbursement for expenses, Contractor must submit to University receipts, invoices, and other documentation requested by University.

Reimbursement for expenses and disbursements will not exceed a maximum expense cap (to be mutually agreed by Contractor and Respondent and provided in the Agreement), without the prior written approval of University.

#### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

#### 1.1 Purpose

University is soliciting competitive sealed proposals from Proposers having suitable qualifications and experience providing services in accordance with the terms, conditions and requirements set forth in this RFP. This RFP provides sufficient information for interested parties to prepare and submit proposals for consideration by University.

By submitting a proposal, Proposer certifies that it understands this RFP and has full knowledge of the scope, nature, quality, and quantity of services to be performed, the detailed requirements of services to be provided, and the conditions under which services are to be performed. Proposer also certifies that it understands that all costs relating to preparing a response to this RFP will be the sole responsibility of the Proposer.

PROPOSER IS CAUTIONED TO READ THE INFORMATION CONTAINED IN THIS RFP CAREFULLY AND TO SUBMIT A COMPLETE RESPONSE TO ALL REQUIREMENTS AND QUESTIONS AS DIRECTED.

#### 1.2 Inquiries and Interpretations

University may in its sole discretion respond in writing to written inquiries concerning this RFP and mail its response as an Addendum to all parties recorded by University as having received a copy of this RFP. Only University's responses that are made by formal written Addenda will be binding on University. Any verbal responses, written interpretations or clarifications other than Addenda to this RFP will be without legal effect. All Addenda issued by University prior to the Submittal Deadline will be and are hereby incorporated as a part of this RFP for all purposes.

Proposers are required to acknowledge receipt of each Addendum as specified in this Section. The Proposer must acknowledge all Addenda by completing, signing and returning the <u>Addenda Checklist</u> (ref. **Section 4** of **APPENDIX ONE**). The Addenda Checklist must be received by University prior to the Submittal Deadline and should accompany the Proposer's proposal.

Any interested party that receives this RFP by means other than directly from University is responsible for notifying University that it has received an RFP package, and should provide its name, address, telephone and facsimile (**FAX**) numbers, and email address, to University, so that if University issues Addenda to this RFP or provides written answers to questions, that information can be provided to that party.

#### 1.3 Public Information

Proposer is hereby notified that University strictly adheres to all statutes, court decisions and the opinions of the Texas Attorney General with respect to disclosure of public information.

University may seek to protect from disclosure all information submitted in response to this RFP until such time as a final agreement is executed.

Upon execution of a final agreement, University will consider all information, documentation, and other materials requested to be submitted in response to this RFP, to be of a non-confidential and non-proprietary nature and, therefore, subject to public disclosure under the *Texas Public Information Act* (ref. Chapter 552, Government Code). Proposer will be advised of a request for public information that implicates their materials and will have the opportunity to raise any objections to disclosure to the Texas Attorney General. Certain information may be protected from release under §§552.101, 552.104, 552.110, 552.113, and 552.131, Government Code.

#### 1.4 Type of Agreement

Contractor, if any, will be required to enter into a contract with University in a form that (i) includes terms and conditions substantially similar to the terms and conditions set forth in **APPENDIX TWO**, and (ii) is otherwise acceptable to University in all respects (**Agreement**).

### 1.5 Proposal Evaluation Process

University will select Contractor by using the competitive sealed proposal process described in this Section. Any proposals that are not submitted by the Submittal Deadline or that are not accompanied by required number of completed and signed originals of the HSP will be rejected by University as non-responsive due to material failure to comply with this RFP (ref. **Section 2.5.4**). Upon completion of the initial review and evaluation of proposals, University may invite one or more selected Proposers to participate in oral presentations. University will use commercially reasonable efforts to avoid public disclosure of the contents of a proposal prior to selection of Contractor.

University may make the selection of Contractor on the basis of the proposals initially submitted, without discussion, clarification or modification. In the alternative, University may make the selection of Contractor on the basis of negotiation with any of the Proposers. In conducting negotiations, University will use commercially reasonable efforts to avoid disclosing the contents of competing proposals.

University may discuss and negotiate all elements of proposals submitted by Proposers within a specified competitive range. For purposes of negotiation, University may establish, after an initial review of the proposals, a competitive range of acceptable or potentially acceptable proposals composed of the highest rated proposal(s). In that event, University may defer further action on proposals not included within the



competitive range pending the selection of Contractor; <u>provided</u>, <u>however</u>, University reserves the right to include additional proposals in the competitive range if deemed to be in the best interest of University.

After the Submittal Deadline but before final selection of Contractor, University may permit Proposer to revise its proposal in order to obtain the Proposer's best and final offer. In that event, representations made by Proposer in its revised proposal, including price and fee quotes, will be binding on Proposer. University will provide each Proposer within the competitive range with an equal opportunity for discussion and revision of its proposal. University is not obligated to select the Proposer offering the most attractive economic terms if that Proposer is not the most advantageous to University overall, as determined by University.

University reserves the right to (a) enter into an agreement for all or any portion of the requirements and specifications set forth in this RFP with one or more Proposers, (b) reject any and all proposals and re-solicit proposals, or (c) reject any and all proposals and temporarily or permanently abandon this selection process, if deemed to be in the best interests of University. Proposer is hereby notified that University will maintain in its files concerning this RFP a written record of the basis upon which a selection, if any, is made by University.

#### 1.6 Proposer's Acceptance of RFP Terms

Proposer (1) accepts [a] Proposal Evaluation Process (ref. Section 1.5 of APPENDIX ONE), [b] Criteria for Selection (ref. Section 2.3), [c] Specifications and Additional Questions (ref. Section 5), [d] terms and conditions of the Agreement (ref. APPENDIX TWO), and [e] all other requirements and specifications set forth in this RFP; and (2) acknowledges that some subjective judgments must be made by University during this RFP process.

#### 1.7 Solicitation for Proposal and Proposal Preparation Costs

Proposer understands and agrees that (1) this RFP is a solicitation for proposals and University has made no representation written or oral that one or more agreements with University will be awarded under this RFP; (2) University issues this RFP predicated on University's anticipated requirements for Work, and University has made no representation, written or oral, that any particular scope of work will actually be required by University; and (3) Proposer will bear, as its sole risk and responsibility, any cost that arises from Proposer's preparation of a proposal in response to this RFP.

#### 1.8 Proposal Requirements and General Instructions

- 1.8.1 Proposer should carefully read the information contained herein and submit a complete proposal in response to all requirements and questions as directed.
- 1.8.2 Proposals and any other information submitted by Proposer in response to this RFP will become the property of University.
- 1.8.3 University will not provide compensation to Proposer for any expenses incurred by the Proposer for proposal preparation or for demonstrations or oral presentations that may be made by Proposer. Proposer submits its proposal at its own risk and expense.
