George C. Mitchell III was born in Dallas and is a third generation Texan on his mother's side of the family. He received a B.S. degree in Accounting from Arkansas Tech University in 1970. He also spent six years in the US Army and the Oklahoma National Guard where he reached the rank of Captain. In 1971 he started his accounting career with Arthur Andersen & Co. in their Oklahoma City office and passed the CPA exam in 1972. After nine years in the audit practice at Arthur Andersen, he spent the next four years as Vice President and Controller for MidCon's US onshore and offshore oil and gas exploration and development headquartered Houston, Texas.

In 1985, George joined Arkoma Production Company, an Arkansas based oil and gas exploration company in which Jerry Jones was the principal stockholder. Over the past 30 years George has served the Jones family in many capacities including Treasurer and Controller for the oil and gas operations, Chief Accounting Officer for the real estate group under Blue Star Investments and for ten years he served as Chief Financial Officer for all of the Jerry Jones enterprises, which included the Dallas Cowboys, AT&T Stadium and Blue Star Investments.
