She also provided the names of numerous services and telephone numbers within the Tarrant County Criminal District attorney's Office for members of the audience to contact if they have questions. Her message included several situations/cases in which the elderly lost their savings and were left with little money for surviving without financial assistance from others. Her talk was most informative, led to many questions and created hope that fraud would not continue to occur and especially to those who were in attendance at the meeting and wiser to the ways of the criminal.

Because of the interest in the subject, there was no time for a formal business meeting. Dr. Theriot did ask for any questions or concerns from the membership regarding other issues following the talk.
