

he Honors College at UT Arlington is a tight-knit community dedicated to fostering academic and personal growth. Within this supportive environment, students uplift one another while receiving guidance and encouragement from staff, faculty, and professors alike.

The Honors College offers students opportunities to enhance their leadership abilities through four student organizations: the Honors College Council, which organizes diverse social and academic activities; the Honors College Advocates, which represent the college at UTA by hosting events and serving as official representatives; the Programming Board, which coordinates approximately 30 student events each semester; and the Veneratio newsletter, which is produced by Honors College students and distributed once per semester.





## **2024-25 SNAPSHOT**

- 600 students were admitted for the fall semester, for a total enrollment of 1200.
- 33 students participated in the Honors Residential Learning Community, the largest cohort ever.
- Over 95 scholarship recipients were awarded more than \$200,000.
- 90 students presented Capstone research across various disciplines at the Honors Research Symposium.
